

DISTRICT OF DRUMMOND
PERSONS ACTING AS SUPERVISORS OF ACCESS RIGHTS

DIRECTIVE

May 1, 2015

This directive is designed to familiarize people who agree to act as supervisors of access rights with the duties of their position.

The parties, **if they agree on the need to have access rights supervised**, must give their written consent for that purpose and attach the *Notice to the supervisor of access rights* duly signed by the person designated as the supervisor. A copy of the Notice is included with this Directive.

On the date on which the written consent, along with the duly signed *Notice to the supervisor of access rights*, is to be filed in the Court record, the parties and the person who has agreed to act as supervisor must be present before the Court. The Court can then verify, if it considers it appropriate, the person's commitment to undertake the duties of a supervisor.

If the application for supervised access rights is contested, the parties and the person recommended to act as the supervisor of access rights if the application is granted must be present before the Court to answer any relevant questions.

If the application for supervision is granted, the *Notice to the supervisor of access rights*, a copy of which is included with this Directive, will be given to the person designated to act as supervisor, who must sign it after reading it. The original of the duly signed notice will be kept in the Court record, and a copy of the duly signed Notice will be given to the person designated to act as supervisor. A copy of an excerpt from the Minutes, setting out the terms and conditions of access, will then be sent to the person designated to act as supervisor by counsel for the party that requested the supervision of access rights. Mention of counsel's undertaking to send the excerpt will be entered in the Minutes.

This Directive takes effect on May 21, 2015.
